

Annual Parish Meeting

The four nominees are Bob Dryden, Andy Kuniholm, Steve Mouton and Steve Price. Two delegates need to be elected for the Diocesan Synod. The nominees are Karla & Rick Denney.

If you will not be in attendance and are a voting member, you can complete a proxy forms and give it to a voting member who will be present. Proxy forms will be available in the narthex. Please note a voting member be a proxy for more than three other members.

According to the Canons of the Reformed Episcopal Church and the By-Laws of the Church of Our Saviour, a voting member is:

- 1. A baptized person who has been confirmed in this parish or who has been confirmed and received in this parish.
- 2. is over 16 years of age.
- 3. has faithfully attended worship over the past 12 months (unless for good cause prevented)
- 4. and has been faithful in working, praying and giving for the support of this parish.

Senior Warden's Corner, April 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Praise God for his faithfulness as we grow together in Him. What a blessing to have 33 new members received or confirmed last Sunday. This is a record for us. Thank you for your patience as we get more prayer books and kneelers for our services, and for being such a warm and loving congregation, reflecting His goodness.

I would like to offer a brief personal perspective on the decision that the Vestry is considering next week: whether to develop plans for a new parish hall, as recommended by the most recent building committee, for the Vestry and congregation to consider, or to add a room onto the existing cottage and modify it internally to meet commercial codes.

In 2020, the Vestry asked me to lead a committee exploring the feasibility of adding onto the cottage. In 2021, I reported that the committee could not recommend it due to the estimated cost, modifications required, and that it would not meet our needs. The Vestry wanted more information though, and tasked a second committee led by Fr. Jonathan to continue to pursue the cottage option, working with an architect to produce construction drawings for the addition and modifications. That committee delivered architectural documents and a general cost structure.

Last September, reflecting on our growing Parish needs, the Vestry commissioned a new building committee so that we could consider a second option—a purpose built parish hall. The Vestry asked me to lead the new committee, tasked with exploring the feasibility and estimated costs. The committee worked with parishioners and outside professionals who provided input at no cost to prepare its proposal, presented to the Vestry last week. It includes:

- updated requirements such as a larger main hall, kitchen, nursery, classrooms, and offices;
- a concept design to meet those needs;
- estimated costs for construction.

We are at the proverbial fork in the road. The Vestry will hold a special meeting on May 6 to assess our needs, resources, and determine which path to pursue. As we have not yet spent any money on the second option, the committee recommends that the Vestry solicit the services of the architect to refine our design and develop plans and renderings for the Vestry and congregation's consideration. And now that we have rough cost estimates, the committee recommends that the Vestry explore the finances for construction.

Whatever path the Vestry chooses, a decision to build anything will need to be made by the congregation, and will require much prayer and a funding campaign. Please pray for wisdom, unity, and God's guidance for us all, and that we will remain focused on His mission.


Sunday school

Current Book: A Canticle for Leibowitz

A Canticle for Leibowitz is a post-apocalyptic social science fiction novel by American writer Walter M. Miller Jr., first published in 1959 and winner of the 1961 Hugo Award. Set in a Catholic monastery in the desert of the southwestern United States after a devastating nuclear war, the book spans thousands of years as civilization rebuilds itself. The monks of the Albertian Order of Leibowitz preserve the surviving remnants of man's scientific knowledge until the world is again ready for it.

Please join us in reading this speculative fiction classic, which explores culture, knowledge, and the particular role Christianity has had in preserving both through the bright and dark years of history.




